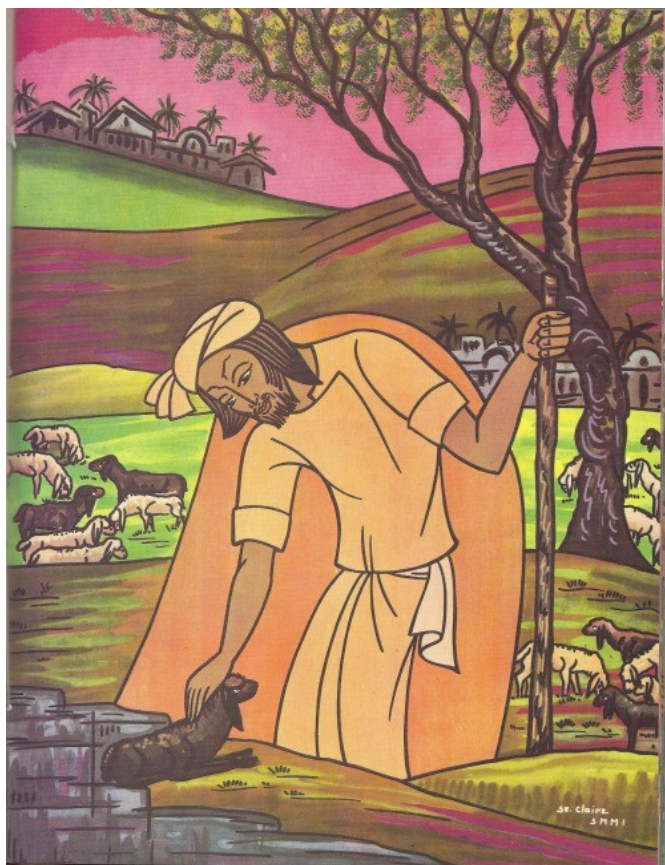

Outreach Charity Review: Every two years Outreach reviews the charities we support and this is the year. Our mission is to provide aid for the "poorest of the poor, homeless, imprisoned or the invisible needy." On Tuesday we met with **SpiritCare** who serves the spiritual and emotional needs of the elderly living in long-term care centers. They work with 66 homes in Alameda, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara counties. Necessarily during COVID times, 75% of the residents have had no outside visitors but SpiritCare continues to send hand-made cards, make quilts and provide spiritual support for residents so they know they aren't forgotten.
